

# All Stars Win From Holdrege In Two Games

Thursday's Game Under  
The Lights Ends With  
Score 3 To 1

Swedell Credited With 2  
Home Runs, 3-Base Hit  
And Single

The first of a series of two defeats was administered to the Holdrege ball club Thursday evening by "Smoke" Donaldson's All-Stars in a fast game that ended 3-1. The second defeat was handed to the local aggregation by the same club Sunday in a faster game, resulting 15-9.

Thursday's game was a snappy affair, taking but an hour and a half for the entire nine innings. Scoring for the All-Stars began in the 2nd, during which they accounted for two runs on two hits, and a base on balls. Ibsen handled their slugging crew nicely and pitched in big time style, putting on one of the finest performances of the year.

Mis-judged drives that might have been handled for put-outs caused all of the visitors' runs. Jones' high fly ball that was well placed between the fielders, got away for a home run in the sixth frame for the 3rd score for the Colored boys.

Errors troubled the visitors and allowed the only Holdrege run. Smith, the All-Star short stop, seemed to have difficulty on grounders and had four misplays marked against him.

The third and seventh innings were bad luck spots for Holdrege. The All-Stars sprinted the bases for five runs in the 3rd and added four in the 7th which was enough to tide them over their bad spots.

Holdrege plays Eustis here next Thursday night and will meet the Cudahy Rex colored champions of Omaha next Sunday afternoon.

Eustis will bring their dazzling left handed pitcher, Neece, who has been beating the best and piling up a strike-out record that hasn't been equalled in these parts. This pair of games will be worth seeing.
