

SCAMPERING RATS ARE TRAPPED EASILY 2 TO 6

TEDDIES VICTORS ALTHOUGH OUTHIT BY COLORED TENNESSEANS.

PALMER SOOD IN PINCHES

Dusky Warriors Run Races Wild Hence Are Unable to Win With Best Twirler.

In the fastest game of the season the Teddies took the Tennessee Rats into camp yesterday by the count of 2 to 6.

J. Pepper Palmer was on the mound for the Teddies and although he was hit for eight clean snucks the rats could not hit in the pinches. For the Rats Donnelson, their star left-hander, officiated and he is one of the greatest pitchers in the bush today, and if it were not for his color he would not be pitching bush ball. The Teddies scored one in the second inning when Storaasli wiffed but the catcher was obliging enough to drop the ball and leave wild to first putting the hardy Norseman on second. He went to third on another pass ball and scored when the catcher dropped another third strike, letting Holmes go to first. The catcher again dropped another third strike letting Holmes go to second and Garzee to first. Dougherty wiffed and Masters ended the inning by grounding out to the first baseman. The Rats tied the count in the third when Goodall the first biter got a triple and after two were out Clay hit for two sacks but was out trying to stretch it into a triple. The Rats went into the lead in the eighth when Johnson hit for three sacks and scored on a pass ball by Holmes. The grand upheaval came in the last of the eighth when Dougherty got on first by an error of the third baseman and took second on the wild throw. Masters attempted to sacrifice but Dougherty was out on third. Corbin scored Masters when he doubled through right field and he went to third on the throw. In McFarland got hit and Davis drew a pass. Palmer forced Davis at second and stole second himself. Storaasli scored Palmer and McFarland when he doubled through left center. Holmes was out at the plate when Garzee hit to the pitcher. In their half of the ninth the Rats could not solve Palmer's delivery and the game was over. The tabulated score:
