

MONDAY'S BALL GAME

Greater Sioux Falls Team Administers Stinging Defeat to the All Nations

Run Up the Largest Score Ever Made Against the Strong Iowa Aggregation

Another large crowd visited the ball park Monday afternoon to witness the second game between the Greater Sioux Falls and All Nations teams. A big game was anticipated. So far as Sioux Falls was concerned it did its share in this respect, but the All Nations seemed to have played themselves out in Sunday's game and they were no match for the locals. Barrett was on the mound for the locals and he pitched great ball throughout. He was hit for nine safeties, but he kept them so well scattered that they only netted one run and that was harvested in the ninth inning.

On the other hand the Sioux Falls team had their batting clothes on and took kindly to Fitzgerald's benders from the very outset. They made seventeen hits which netted fourteen runs, ten of which were earned. Three home runs, one each by Hansell, Campbell and Osgood, were made off the Iowa slab artist. Every member of the Sioux Falls team got a hit, and Bruce out of five times up head out four safe ones.
