

In the All-Nations' return visit to Rourke park, the Storz Triumphs secured dire revenge for their former losses, by applying a coat of whitewash on their determined visitors. Score 5 to 0.

Another capacity crowd attended to witness the rival clubs struggle for supremacy. The interest lagged somewhat after the brewers had amassed a large lead, but increased towards the last part of the game, when the All-Nations attempted a couple of rallies.

A double bill was staged for the benefit of those present. Frank Quigley's A. O. U. W. crowd vied for honors with Jimmy Mullen's Alamitos in the preliminary battle. A pitching duel by the two southpaws, Holland and Adams, resulted in a 3 to 3 score at the end of the seventh, when time was called to allow the second game to proceed.
