Simpson forced Griff. out at home, Robinson forced a run on four balls, Dakin hit to short and in the out at 1st, Simpson scored.

In the same inning the visitors score on a hot one to short with the big Jap on third.

Griffin made the star play of the day, but Gustophson failed to "come to" in time to take advantage of it.
