

The ball game last Thursday between the All Nations and the Windom team was one of the best ever seen on the local diamond, and resulted in a victory for Windom after 10 innings of play. The defeat of the locals the week previous only added interest to the last game and a good attendance was on hand. Donaldson was again in the box for the visitors and in spite of the fact that he struck out sixteen men he was not sufficient to win the game. Barr was doing the slab work for Windom and he pitched the game of his life, striking out 16 of the heavy batters of the mixed-up team. The Windom boys played a good game all the way thru, and for that matter so did the visitors, but the game belonged to the locals by right. It is said that this is the first game Donaldson has lost in the last fifty in which he has played and the defeat did not set well. A change was made in two or three of the Windom team, Knox playing third, Leeds second and another new fielder, while some of the Windom boys took a rest. Knox has been signed to play third base for the balance of the season, the team being short a man on that sack.
