

**MARSHALL AGAIN DEFEATS ALL

With the mud too deep to play at the grounds Marshall took the All-Nations into camp down at the Chautauqua grounds with fences to crawl under and the river to swim in.

In the second inning Marshall got a severe set back when Donaldson hit a two bagger, Dunbar sacrificed and Mikami, the Jap, hit a scorcher past Morse, scoring Donaldson.

Marshall evened up in the next inning when Luke hit a double and Klein and Pfremer singles.

In the fourth Donaldson started trouble again and with two errors and two sacrifices the All-Nations scored again.

Marshall won the game in the fifth, scoring two. Lambert hit, Luke sacrificed, Klein hit, Pfremer sacrificed and Morse drew an error at third and we were two to the good.

The ninth inning was a shaky one for Marshall. The first two men went out at first and fanned, but Jackson hit, Walla got first on an error, Mendez hit and Klatner, the Chinaman, hit a high fly which Lambert smothered.
