

Dulanti, New Packer Hurler, Defeats Tulsa in the Third Game

HOMERS WIN FROM OILERS

RUSSELL IS KNOCKED FROM BOX IN FIRST.

HAMILTON IS HITTING STAR

Winning Runs Scored in First Three Innings—Haugland Goes in Box and Finishes Strong—Hamilton, Metz, Hemingway Hit.

Tulsa, Okla., Aug. 11.—Ray Dulanti, a rawboned rookie from the semi-pro ranks of North Platte, Neb., made a spectacular debut in the professional ranks of baseball Friday, holding the hardest hitless outing in the Western league by a half dozen in the Sioux City hurler, and as a result of his performance on the hilltop, the Packers welcomed the Oilers, 6 to 4, in the third game of a series, thereby taking the lead at two games to one.

For the first third of the battle, the men of Lellevell connected hard and rather frequently with Dulanti's offerings and he seemed to have trouble in locating the ball. That after Luke Stuart opened Tulsa's half of the fourth with a home run, not a hit did he record. Only 13 men faced Dulanti in his first outing, and he pitched the Oilers, 6 to 4, in the third game of a series, thereby taking the lead at two games to one.

Dulanti, who is 25 years old, was secured by Manager Chick Mattick of the Packers, 10 days ago to fill the vacancy created on the box staff when Cy Williams jumped. Last year he had pitched in 20 games and had a record of 11-10. He is a right-handed pitcher with a good curve ball, fair control, but no great amount of steam. Manager Mattick considers him a very good prospect, capable of doing the job of a regular against the best of leading clubs.

The Packers won by rapping off Russell, their old teammate, in the first inning. Hamilton and Hemingway hit home runs, Metz singled and Metz doubled with none out, scoring three runs. Haugland then relieved Russell and pitched the rest of the game. Home runs by Hamilton in the second and Metz in the third, and Bish's steal of home in the fifth, gave the Packers the rest of their runs.

The Oilers scored two in the second on hits by Lellevell, Stuart and Crosby and another in the third on two walks and Lellevell's double. Stuart's home run in the fourth was Tulsa's last run and also the last hit off Dulanti.

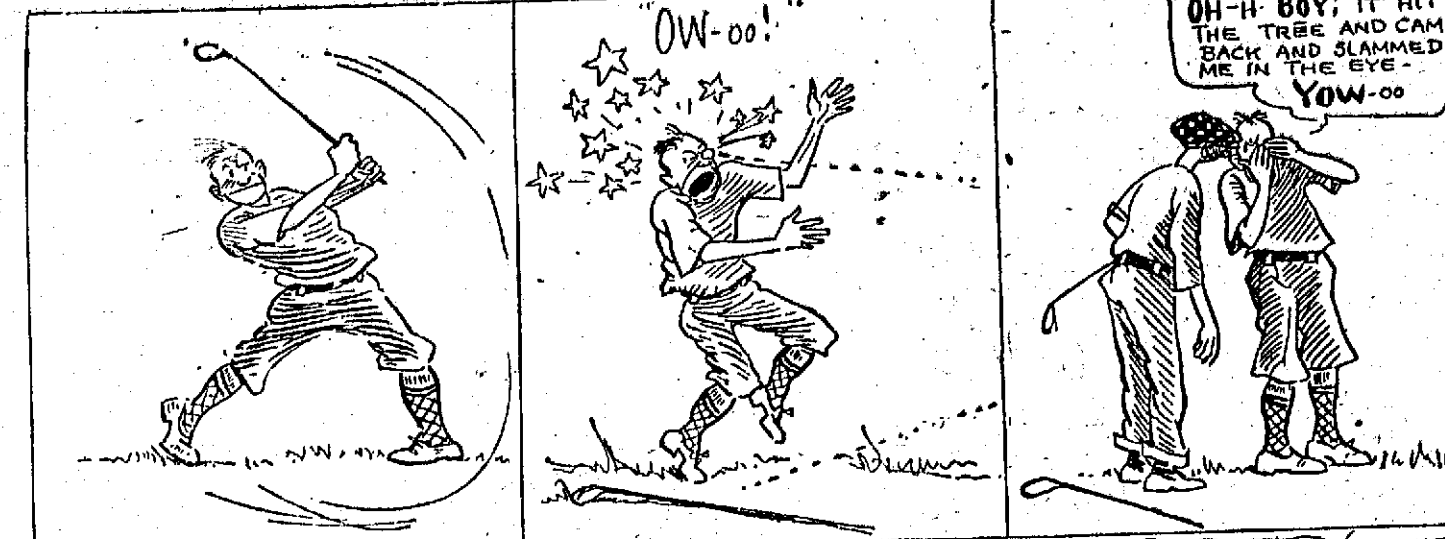
