Durham led off with a triple to left center in this inning and after Smith had walked and Donaldson had grounded out, Dunbar bounced a single off Simpson's glove, allowing Durham to register. Simpson then braced up and fanned Blatnier and Crow, retiring the side.

A brace of singles, with a passed ball sandwiched between, allowed the Giants to tie the count in their half of the fourth and they forged ahead in the sixth when they sent another run across on Coley's single, his stolen base and Lynch's triple.

Giants Get 4 in Eighth.

With one out in the eighth Turner singled. Payne was hit by a pitched ball and Coley singled, filling the bases. When Donaldson dropped Lynch's tall fly in left, all three scored and Lynch tallied a moment later on Peters double.
