The Langdon club got to Pitcher Wilkus the first inning for four hits and three runs; from then on Wilkus only allowed two hits and no runs, while the All-Nation club batted in six runs.

The second game, 4 to 1, was a fast game; the Langdon club secured one run in the first inning; the All-Nations failed to score until the sixth inning, when they tied the score. Bluekoi, the Hawaiian, then hit safe, also Crow, the Indian, secured a single, and Wilkus, who was put in to pinch hit for Terino, secured a two-bagger, scoring Bluekoi and Crow, making three runs in the ninth inning for the All-Nations, which proved enough to win the game, as Mendez, the Cuban, pitched the last inning for the All-Nations, striking out the first three batters to face him and ending one of the most interesting games played on the Langdon grounds this season.
