Elmore scored the first run in the fourth when Smith singled, Jude sacrificed and Kurke doubled to right, Smith scoring on this hit. In the seventh Coleman was passed, and Bluekoi, Donaldson, Wilkus, Crowe and Henbury hit safe, five runs being tallied. Elmore made a great attempt in the eighth to tie the score, but fell one short. Smith doubled, Jude walked and Kurke again doubled, Smith scoring. With two men out, Kinnen dropped Henbury's throw to first and Jude and Kurke scored.
