# Colored Men Make Six Hits to San Diego's Twelve; Baer- wald Gets a Homer.

Victory is sweet. The dish served up by the Bears yesterday when they romped away from the Giants, 8 to 1, left the most palatable, satisfying taste in the mouth of the big crowd, hungry for one more good game when the Bears were really right. And right they were yesterday.

As a start in baseballs games is considered half the battle, so it proved yesterday, for before the Bears were headed off in the first frame, Gatewood was lambasted for three singles and two doubles and four men were sent across the plate. The session was the biggest feast for the crowd's eyes that has been enjoyed in many a moon.

Gatewood, whose stormy session in the first inspired Manager Rube Foster to warm up Dougherty, his star pitcher, remounted the mound in the

second till the Bears rapped three successive doubles to center, and the fifth Bear registered at home.

### Dougherty Does Better

Dougherty replaced him in the third, and although pitching a lost game, the southpaw swept the Bears' slate clean till the seventh, when Baerwald hit a four-sacker over the "Hit Me" signs in center, and scored Daley and Chief Meyers before him, making the runs 8 to 1, and thus it remained:

The Giants' one run was made in the fourth by Hill, who walked, went to third on a fielder's choice, and scored on Monroe's out at first by Bennett.

Schultz, the Philadelphia National, on the mound for the locals, was most mystifying with his jump balls and the spitters, and ran things with a high and imperial hand.

Downey, the little K. C. Blue, initiated Gatewood in the first by a single to the center jungle, and by way of contrast Bennett bunted, both arriving safely at the first two stations. But Downey was forced out at third in the next play by a hit to the pitcher.

by Daley. And Bennett and Daley came home on a double by the Chief. Baerwald repeated, scoring Meyers, and went on to third on Walker's single. He made the fourth score on Carish's ground-out, thus preventing Carish's ground-out Taylor to Pierce. Hap Myers then did the unconventional thing of striking out, thus preventing Schultz alone from batting in that inning.

### **Bears Fattened Averages**

The Bears batted about .400 yesterday, getting 12 hits in 33 times up, and made but two costless errors. Walker hit safely three of four times, while Baerwald got a double and a homer in four times up.

Pierce, the Giants' first baseman, was not hit on the head yesterday. He struck out twice, and drew one walk. He says getting hit is a hard way of earning a base, but mighty good to shake up one's ideas. He has had 'em bounced off his knob every game until yesterday, and he has done more "talking it up" than the Giants ever knew him to do before.

The Giants will remain in San Diego until Wednesday, when they meet the Bears again. Saturday and Sunday the Cornett Giants from Los Angeles will clash with the Bears here. All games will be called at 2:30.
