

ALL NATIONS DEFEAT THE STORZ BY 7 TO 6

Gilt Edge Ball Played by Both
Crews, Pitchers Behaving
Like Professionals.

Falconer of the Brewers Heavy
With the Hickory, Collect-
ing 4 Hits in 5 Trips.

Although the Rourkes were playing at
Sioux City yesterday afternoon, Vinton
Street park was not deserted, as the
Storz team and the All-Nations were

fighting it out for the first time this season. When the battle was over the score showed, All-Nations 7, Storz 6.

The game was fast and interesting from start to finish and kept the 4,000 fans guessing until the last batter was out. Both teams played gilt-edged ball for the first six rounds and the twirlers were going at it like a couple of leaguers. McGuire was the slab artist for the Brewers, while Mendez, the "Cuban wonder," heaved them over for the visitors.

The feature of the game was the hitting of Falconer for the Storz, who made four hits out of five trips to the plate, and the base-running of Donaldson.

The same teams will play again this afternoon, with Donaldson, the strike-out man, on the mound for the All-Nations, and Olson in the box for the Triumphs. The game will start at 3 o'clock.
