

TATES WIN TWO FROM MONARCHS

Batting Brings One Vic- tory, Pitching Another.

The Tate Stars pulled a surprise yesterday when they defeated the fast Kansas City Monarchs at Tate field, 8 to 6 and 6 to 4, in a double header.

The first game was a slugging match, in which the Tates out-hit their opponents. Brown, with four hits out of five times at bat, and Boyd, with three out of three, led the Tates' attack.

The second victory was due greatly to the pitching of Hamilton, who held the visitors to six hits, while the Tates made eleven, including a home run by Johnston.
