

STORZ TRIUMPHS LOSE TO ALL NATIONS, 6 TO 5

Spirited Rally in Eighth Inning
Puts Brewers to
the Bad.

Double-Header Scheduled for
Today to Complete Three-
Game Series.

The All-Nations, accompanied by their pair of notable stars, Donaldson and Mendez, indulged in a spirited rally that defeated the brewers in the first game of a three-game series that will decide the

supremacy of the two clubs. The battle was decided with the All-Nations on the heavy end of a 6 to 5 score.

The brewers were leading until the opening of the eighth with a rosy outlook for victory when the tide of battle was reversed and Alderman bumped into a fusillade of hits that netted the cosmopolitan crew five runs. Two men were down when Mendez secured a life on a dropped throw by Drummy. Five hits followed in rapid succession that clinched the game for the visitors.

With a large lead staring them in their countenances the Triumphs came back in their half of the eighth and found Mendez for three runs. Olson was on second, but Hachten, who batted for Alderman, fanned in the pinch.

Captain Blatner took no chances with Senor Mendez and replaced the Cuban with Donaldson in the ninth. The long colored boy has lost none of his cunning, as exhibited in the ninth when he fanned three of the brewers.

Mendez and Donaldson as usual constituted a large part of the visitors' strength. Donaldson was a busy boy in center field, while Mendez showed his usual fox-like shrewdness on the mound.

Alderman for the Storz worked nicely up to the fatal eighth, allowing but three scattered singles, two of them being of the scratch variety.

Graham booted Blatner's grounder in the second. Donaldson sacrificed and Moore got an infield single that scored the run.

Durkee tied the count with a safe one, followed by Welch's drive. The brewers forged to the front on Welch's single and Lawler's double. The eighth inning brought on plenty of excitement and the noise still continued when Donaldson entered the slab and stopped the brewers in their tracks.

Today a double bill will be staged. The first game is billed for 2 p. m. Jack Fugate, an ex-Bourke twirler, and "Phenom" Olson will be in the points for Bradford's crowd, while Donaldson and Shattuck will probably work for the cosmopolitan aggregation.
