KANSAS CITY, May 29.—John Donaldson, a negro who is pitching for the All Nationals, a team composed of players of different nations, has established a pitching record that probably never will be equaled. Donaldson has pitched thirty hitless innings. Last week he held the Schmelzers without a blow in nine innings; during the week he let the K. C. K. All Stars down without a hit and this week

here again he held the Schmelzers hitless in a twelve-inning game making thirty consecutive hitless innings. In the twelve-inning game he struck out twenty-five men. The Schmelzers is a very strong team and all the members have at one time or the other been in the Class A leagues. Muggsy McGraw saw Donaldson pitch in Cuba during his world tour and made the remark that if Donaldson was white he would give \$50000 for him.
