

DETROIT STARS COP. 3 TO 2

Kansas City, Sept. 3.—The Monarchs were nosed out in a hurling duel between John Donaldson and Gatewood in the second game of the series with Detroit at Association park, the visitors stowing away a 3 to 2 victory before a crowd of 8,000.

For seven rounds, Gatewood, the Detroit hurling ace, held the Mendez crowd scoreless, yielding only three scattered hits. In the eighth, however, the Monarchs staged an attack which netted them a pair of runs, but they lacked the punch to collect the needed tally. Holland, who replaced Gatewood on the mound in the eighth, pitched steady ball.

Donaldson pitched great ball up until the sixth frame, when the visitors cleated out a pair of healthy base knocks which netted them as many runs. Another counter was added in the seventh, which clinched the victory for the Stars.
