Brattner cleaned up with a home run over the left field fence. Dunbar, with a single, scored Brattner. 3 hits, 4 runs.

In the latter half of the ninth the White Sox took new life, when Holm hit the second one over for two bases. Sucher was allowed first base on an error by Cline, and Fromme made a single, scoring Holm and sending Sucher to third. Smith, nowever, struck out, closing the game.
