Both Clubs Fielded Brilliantly
Throughout Entire Contest, Marr
and McKnight Leading.

RUSTENHAVEN IS EFFECTIVE.

Smith Relieved Weeks in First—Same
Teams Play at Home Tomorrow
With John Donaldson Work-
ing for Visitors.

ball for the Soldiers' Home club

yesterday afternoon at the Home and the All Nation team was downed in a thrilling exhibition 3 to 2. The game was featured throughout by fast playing by both teams and fine pitching. The fielding of Runt Marr and Maurice McKnight was a feature.

The one big feature of the afternoon, however, was the pitching of Rustenhaven. The southpaw was in great form and his mystifying curves had his opponents baffled throughout. Smith, a spitball artist, twirled a good game for the losers.

The same teams will play Wednesday afternoon at the Home. Donaldson, the celebrated colored twirler, will pitch for the All Nations, while Rustenhaven, Fitzgerald or Jack Killilay will hurl for the home. There is considerable rivalry between these two clubs and as this will be the final exhibition at the

Home, it should be one of the best games of the season. Dear's club has been unable to solve Donaldson's delivery this season, and in three games the Dears succeeded in getting five hits.

The game by innings:

First inning—McKnight singled to left. Crow sacrificed Rustenhaven to Wolff. Tierney grounded out, Marr to Wolff. McKnight going to third on the play. As Rustenhaven wound up McKnight stole home. Marr first up for the Home doubled over Donaldson's head in center. Flagg flew out to Crow. Richardson singled to left. Faeth threw the ball away trying for Marr at third and the latter scored. Wolff singled. Kirmeyer fouled out to Tierney. Brokaw out Smith to Tierney. Weeks started to twirl for the All Nations but became sick and was relieved by Smith.

Second inning—Donaldson out Marr to Wolff. Durham fanned. Faeth out

Rustehaven to Wolff.

Collins doubled to left. Shore walked. Rustehaven hit to Smith and Collins was caught at third. Marr fanned. Flagg fanned.

Third inning—Blucoc singled. Henry flew out to Shore. McKnight lined out to Richardson. Crow out Marr to Wolff.

Richardson grounded out Faeth to Tierney. Wolff flew out to Donaldson. Kirmeyer fanned.

Fourth inning—Tierney out Rustehaven to Wolff. Smith fanned. Donaldson out Marr to Wolff.

Brokaw fanned. Collins singled. Shore hit into a double play, Tierney to Blucoc to Tierney.

Fifth inning—Durham flew out to left. Faeth walked. Blucoc fanned. Henry lined to Shire.

Rustehaven walked and was forced at second when Marr hit to Blucoc. Flagg flied out to right. Richardson was safe on Faeth's error. Wolff flew out to McKnight.

Sixth inning—McKnight whiffed. Crow flew out to Richardson. Tierney out Flagg to Wolff.

Kirmeyer fanned. Brokaw grounded

out Faeth to Tierney. Collins hit to Smith and was out at first.

Seventh inning—Smith fanned. Donaldson fanned. Durham fanned. Rustehave was using his spitter to great effect.

Shore walked. Rustehaven flew out to McKnight, McKnight made a pretty catch of the ball after a long run. Marr singled. Flagg struck out. Richardson hit a hard drive at Smith which the latter barely succeeded in getting hold of, he then threw wild to first, Shore and Marr scoring.

Eighth inning—Faeth struck out. Blucoe singled. Henry hit to Rustehaven who threw him out at first. McKnight flew out o Brokaw.

Kirmeyer fouled out to Tierney. Brokaw out Smith to Tierney. Collins fanned but went to first when Durham missed the last strike. Shore out Blucoe to Tierney.

Ninth inning—Crow doubled to the left field fence, Kirmeyer made a quick return of the ball holding him to the

keystone sack. Tierney flew out to Marr. Crow scored on Smith's single to left. Marr took Donaldson's ground-er back of second and tossed Smith out at second. Durham fanned.
