

BALL PLAYERS OF MANY NATIONS COMING

City Team Arranging to Have Team
on Coast-to-Coast Tour Here
For Game Friday, May 7.

Japanese, Cubans, Hawaiians and Indians will be seen in action on the baseball diamond here a week from tomorrow, according to arrangements which are being made by the city team to match a game with the All-Nations team. This is touring the country from coast to coast, playing in the larger cities. Its members travel in a special coach and, as the club's name indicates, are representatives of various nationalities.

The game, if the arrangements are made, will be the opening one of the season here. The city team players have accepted with good grace the decision by Mayor Clover that the diamond, which is in City Park, should not be used for Sunday games, and will try to bring good teams here for week-day games, in the hope that the attendance will justify the venture.

They are planning for an automobile parade and other festivities to mark the beginning of the season, and would be glad to have a part-holiday in the business district at hours to suit the convenience of the merchants and give the members of their forces—incidentally the business men themselves—a chance to see the game.
