Edwards in Lineup

The American Legion lineup will be intact, with the exception of Muggs Brown, regular first baseman. Brown has departed from Rockford on a vacation. Nelson Potter, Mt. Morris college athlete, will take his place. William "Posewitz" Edwards, sensational third baseman and lead-off man, will be in the lineup, contrary to expectations.

Edwards recently injured his leg and his appearance tomorrow was doubtful. Manager Joe Murray an-

nounces, however, that he will start at his regular position.

Lengquist to Hurl

Bob Lengquist will pitch for Rockford, with Ivan Johannes catching. Zitzke will be at short; Brandt at second; O'Malley, right field; Murphy, center field; and Thelin in left field.

The starting pitcher of the Monarchs has not been announced, but they have several on hand. It is possible that Cooper, the puzzling southpaw who defeated Rockford last year, will be used. Beverly, Thompson or Rogan are other prospects.

Just what the Rockford coppers will use for baseball players against Freeport is doubtful. The pretzel custodians of the law have handed the local ticket-givers two setbacks, and Rockford is anxious to avenge those defeats. Hal Campbell is the probable choice with Folke Bengtson behind the plate. They may, however, change positions before the game is over.
