Sioux Falls woke up with a start Sunday afternoon and discovered that she was sporting a real baseball team. The famous All Nations managed to win a 2 to 0 shut out but it took Donadson 13 innings to do it. The series of two broke even, Sioux Falls winning yesterday's game, 14 to 1.

Sunday's game was the best article of baseball ever played on a diamond in Sioux Falls. The crowd of over 1,200 present were worked to a pitch of frensy at tight places. More excitement and spirit was displayed at the game than at any time before this season.

Donaldson, the dusky south-paw with country wide fame as a strickout pitcher surely lived up to his reputation in Sunday's game. In fact he played the entire game himself. For the matter of fielders behind him it might be well to have as many posts. However, the All Nation fielders got more work than in any previous game they have played. The black smoke struck out 23 batters, made six assists and two putouts which shows how much he did toward putting out the 39 Sioux Falls batters.
