Yesterday a pretty plichers battle was staged between Gaspar and Donaldson, when the All Nations took the locals into camp by a 1 to 0 score. A big crowd was on hand despite the heavy clouds and muddy roads.

Neither side was able to hit the ball at critical times until the first half of the ninth inning, when Geo. Chief Walla, the heavy hitting Indian of the visitors slammed the ball against the left field fence for a two bagger, with one man on base. This was the only tally registered during the game.

Donaldson, the black pitcher, who last year held the locals to 1 hit, proved to be as good a pitcher as ever, allowing but two hits and striking out fourteen. He was invincible at critical times, his twisters holding the batters helpless. Gaspar, also pitched a good game, allowing but three hits and striking out fifteen. He was particularly stingy at the dangerous moments, striking out men when a hit would have meant one or more scores.
