Marshall won the game in the fifth, scoring two. Lambert hit, Luke sacrificed, Klein hit, Pfremmer sacrificed and Morse drew an error at third and we were two to the good.

The ninth inning was a shaky one for Marshall. The first two men went out at first and fanned, but Jackson hit. Walla got first on an error, Mendez hit and Klatner, the Chinaman, hit a high fly which Lambert smothered.
