All Nations Lost to Anoka.
 Anoka, Minn., July 31 (Special).—In one of the best pitching duels seen here this season the Anoka team broke the All Nations' long string of victories yesterday by defeating them by the close score of 3 to 2. Brandell secured three doubles and practically won the game for Anoka.

Walter Robbins from St. Paul pitched for the locals and had the heaviest hitters of the visitors eating out of his hand, allowing but five hits, one a terrific drive by the Cuban, Mendez, in the tenth. At this stage Robbins was weakening from throwing a heavy ball and Nevitt was sent in. He easily retired the side with the All Nations leading, 2 to 1. Sheley got on and Pusch followed suit. Couette batted for McCarthy and laid one down with the mighty Donaldson pitching, Sheley and Pusch going to 3rd and 2nd. With two out Brandell waited until the count was 3 balls and 2 strikes. Donaldson was working slow endeavoring to strike Brunny out. Brandell singled sharply to the left field, Sheley and Pusch scoring and winning the game.
