The score at the end of the eighth infing, when they quit, was 4 to 0 in favor of the visitors, and could easily have been several more had they cared to make them. The visitors made 11 hits while the home team only 3. David made 25 errors and the All Nations none.

The mighty Donaldson lived up to reputation for being the greatest slab artist out of the big leagues. He held the Sunday game at his will and at no time was he in danger. He struck out 17 opposing batters and allowed but three hits, two singles and a double. His team mates gave him errorless support. During this time the All-Nations were not having an easy time at the bat. Olson kept the 10 hits scattered and but for two bad errors would have held them to one score. These two errors resulted in three scores and David City lost, 4 to 0.
