The All-Nations without Donaldson would not be considered as dangerous foes. The sensational Negro southpaw showed his old-time cunning, and his sharp curve worked havoc among the Brandels stickers. He whiffed nineteen, besides possessing perfect control. Olson, with a record of thirteen straight wins, gave the colored man a hard battle until the seventh.
