The Schmelzer All-Nations won the first of a four-game series from the champion negro team, the A. B. C.s of Indianapolis, yesterday afternoon at Association park, 4 to 0. John Donaldson, colored pitcher of the All-Nations, did the mound work and he had the Indianapolis team on his staff during the entire game. Only one of the visitors reached third base. Donaldson allowed but two hits, one in the seventh inning and the other in the eighth. He struck out seven.

The All-Nations didn't score until the sixth frame, when they put one counter across the plate. In the seventh they tallied three times off the delivery of Williams. The fielding of Olson, Mendez and Lyons was a feature of the game. The same teams will play again today at 8 o'clock.
