These two teams displayed some real baseball, making all their plays seemingly with no effort. The colored team is reputed to be the fastest traveling team in the U.S., and hold the title of being colored World's Champions. Most of the players on this team have played in the National Colored League for years. Two of the world's greatest colored pitchers, John Donaldson and Bullet Rogan, made their appearance in the game, and both were so effective that the Davids were unable to connect safely. The Davids in turn presented a formidable array of players. Many of their players have played with the big leagues. Most notable of all, perhaps, was the appearance of Grover Cleveland Alexander, who, almost single-handed, pitched the St. Louis Cardinals to a World's Championship in 1926. Earl Smith, who has played with the Cardinals and New York Giants, was also present in the game.
