ALL NATIONS WIN IN NINTH INNING FINISH

SIoux FALLS CLUB HERE TODAY

Luverne Grays Lose to All Nations Club in Ninth Inning by 4 to 5 Score—Game at Sioux Falls Sunday Called in Fifth Inning on Account of Rain—Sioux Falls Will Play Here This Afternoon, and Jasper Sunday Afternoon—Luverne H. S. Team Defeats Rock Rapids.

This afternoon the Luverne Grays will meet the Greater Sioux Falls club at Athletic park, and on Sunday the Jasper club will be the Grays opponents in another game at Athletic park. Manager Guthrie is now arranging for two games with Windom, to be played the latter part of next week.

The Luverne Grays went down to defeat for the second time this week, when on Tuesday afternoon, they were defeated by the All-Nation club. But it was only by the "skin of their teeth" that this much tooted semi-professional team was able to become the victors, the final score being 5 to 4.

Guthrie and Christensen were the battery for Luverne, and Mendez and Reeves served in this capacity for the All Nations. Guthrie struck out seven men, hit two and issued one pass. Mendez fanned only six men, and hit two.

It was in the second inning that the All Nations secured their first score. Reeves, the score maker, reached the initial sack by being hit by a pitched ball, was advanced to second by Donaldson's sacrifice hit, went to third when Dunbar exploded, Roland to Schaub, and scored on Castanier's single into left field. Shellaford and Naito both struck out.

In the next inning the All Nations annexed three more tallies: Blatnier walked. Walla was retired, Sherwood to Schaub. Blatnier scored on a single by Mendez. Reeves then singled into left field, stopping at second. Donaldson followed with a two-bagger into center, Mendez and Reeves scoring. Guthrie hit Dunbar and a neat double play followed when Castanier grounded to Guthrie, who retired

Donaldson at third and Sherwood heaved the sphere to Schaub in time to beat Castanier to the initial sack.

From this time until Luverne's half of the sixth inning neither of the teams made any headway in circling the diamond. In the sixth inning, after two men had been retired, Campbell, on behalf of Luverne, doubled into left field, and scored on Schaub's two base hit into center. Simpson followed with a single into left field. A few minutes later he stole second, but Schaub was caught off the third sack.

The seventh inning failed to produce a score for either club, but in the eighth Luverne gladdened the hearts of local fans by securing the necessary three tallies to tie the score: Sherwood, the first man up, grounded out, Walla to Dunbar. Roland singled into right, Campbell drew a pass and the bases were filled when Schaub's hot liner hit the umpire. Simpson followed with a two base hit into center field, Roland and Campbell scoring. Guthrie bowled one to Mendez, who fumbled, but got the ball home in time to retire Schaub. Christensen grounded into right and Simpson crossed the plate on Blatnier's wild throw home. A few seconds later Guthrie was caught at the home plate.

The deciding tally was made by the All Nations in the ninth, when Blatnier, the first man up, put a high one clear over the fence in left field, and walked home.

The feature of the game was the work of Luverne's outfield. Campbell's work in center field was

especially spectacular. Of the five long drives that he got his mitt on during the game three were very difficult.
