

MONARCHS LOST IN TWELFTH.

Detroit Stars Nosed Out a Victory in Late Rally, 4 to 3.

The Monarchs were toppled out of second place in the National Negro League yesterday when the Detroit Stars staged a twelfth inning rally which handed them a victory in the opening combat, 4 to 3.

The Monarchs established a 2-run lead in the second round and held it until the sixth, when a pair of costly errors enabled the visitors to tie the count. Currie, who started on the mound for the Stars crew, pitched great ball for eleven rounds, allowing the enemy only six blows. Crawford succeeded him.

In the seventh game of the series this afternoon (Saturday), the bustling ace of the Stars, will be on the mound for Detroit, while John Shoulders, the Monarch "iron man," will oppose him. The score:
