

MONARCHS IN A TIGHT TIE.

Indianapolis A. C.'s and Kansas City Negroes Played a 1 to 1 Draw.

The Monarchs and the Indianapolis A. C. battled fifteen innings yesterday to a 1 to 1 tie in the second game of the series at Washington Park. The game was called by Umpire Rice at the end of the fifteenth on account of darkness. It was a pitcher's battle between Currie and Johnson with honors about even. Johnson struck out thirteen batters while Currie turned back eleven from the plate on strikes.

The Monarchs scored their run in the first inning when Washington dropped Fortuna's drive. The runner advanced on Currie's infield out and crossed the plate on McNair's safe hit to left. The Monarchs wasted their run in the sixth.

Clark doubled to left, went to third on Washington's infield out and scored on Washington's sacrifice fly to foul ground.
