

Monarchs Even Up Series; Beat Indianapolis 10-3

The Monarchs evened up the series with the Indianapolis A. B. C. negro national league baseball club in the second game yesterday, by bunching hits in the fourth inning and piling up a lead which easily clinched them a 10 to 3 victory. A crowd of 9,000 witnessed the game.

The Hoosier aggregation pushed a run across in the opening chapter, but the locals came right back and evened up the count in their half of the inning and a close battle was waged up until the fourth frame with Donaldson and Dismukes retiring the sides in regular order. In the fourth, however, the Monarchs leaned against the benders of Dismukes and scored six runs before Charleston, a left-hander, was sent in to the rescue. Another marker was netted off Charleston's delivery in the fourth, while the locals gathered two more in the fifth.

Aside from the first and sixth stanzas, Donaldson was never in danger and kept the visitors' blows well scattered. The third game of the series will be played this afternoon at 3 o'clock. Score:
