

SANTA FE NINE OPENS SEASON WITH VICTORY

**Wins Easily From All-Nations
by 6 to 2 Score.**

**Opportune Hits Combined With Costly
Errors Produce Runs—Local
Team in Good Form.**

Hits when hits meant runs, combined with unfortunate errors at the crucial moment, several of which were occasioned by a glaring setting sun in the west, brought the Santa Fe team a 6-to-2 victory over the All-Nations team, of Kansas City, at League park yesterday afternoon.

Saffel scored in the first inning after he got on by a single. He was advanced by sacrifices and scored on a single.

The Santa Fe nine counted one run in the third, two in the sixth and one each in the seventh and eighth. The runs were made from hits combined with errors on the part of the Kansas

City players.

The All-Nations scored two runs in the ninth inning when they started a hitting bee.

Saffel pitched a good game for the home team the first six innings, allowing but one hit. Seitz, who was on the mound in the remaining three innings, allowed but three hits.

Donaldson yielded six hits to the home club in six innings. He was replaced by Mendez in the seventh, who allowed two hits in the two innings.

Saffel struck out five men, Seitz five and Donaldson five.
