ALL NATIONS 3-LUVERNE 0.

Playing under very adverse conditions, due to the darkness of the approaching storm, the Luverne Cubs were defeated by the All Nations professional base ball aggregation by a 3 to 0 score in a five inning battle staged at Athletic park Wednesday afternoon.

Donaldson, the colored twirler for the All Nations, appeared to have things much his own way, for he struck out five men and only allowed one hit. Dressen was on the mound for the Cubs, and while he apparently had lots of stuff on the ball, he was not able to control it.

A hit, three passes and two wild throws enabled the All Nations to corral two scores in the first inning, and their last score was annexed in the third, when Mendz walked, went to second on a passed ball, and scored as Dressen made a wild heave to F. Novak.

Dressen, who made the hit secured by the Cubs, was the only member of the Luverne team to reach a base during the five innings.
